Second Show: South Lake Union Call for Entry

Fabulous Exhibition Opportunity: NWDC/SLU Redux.

NWDC has been invited to do a **second show** at the UW Medical Buildings, a new research facility in Seattle's upscale medical /tech district, South Lake Union. This invitation is a direct result of community appreciation. After NWDC's first show at SLU, art manager Peggy Weiss received these comments from one of the lead scientists:

I haven't understood how exactly this art display came to the SLU campus. Perhaps you could explain it to me?

It has made a huge impact. So many people comment on the beautiful works on display. It seems like I notice something different every time I walk past, and I smile to myself in appreciation. I am hoping that there can be some type of ongoing exhibit, because the place will look sterile when these are taken down.

Thanks for your role in enriching our environment. You've added an element of class.

With the second show, we hope to benefit from the first show's steep learning curve. The second show will be trimmed down to 60 pieces. Work will be curated by NWDC Lifetime Achievement Award recipient Larry Metcalf. Work will be selected for it's quality and its suitability for the site.

Given the smaller scope of this show, please be apprised that while all work will be appreciated, it is likely that not all work can be accepted. Also, if you enter a piece, we expect that piece to be available to show, if it is selected.

Work in the show may be for sale. There is no commission.

NWDC /SLU Redux will run from Feb 8 to May 25. An opening reception on May 4 will coincide with SLU's Spring Art Walk.

For NWDC/SLU Redux, work will be collected at designated members' houses and then transported to SLU, so members won't have to drive into town.

Entry Requirements:

Submit up to two pieces.

Images:

Send jpeg images with 1500 - 2000 pixels on the longest side. Label images with your last

name-title of piece.

Example: Stanton-Repoman Never Sleeps.jpg.

The on-line application will be available for use beginning November 19th. Applications will be accepted till mid-night December 17th.

Early application: If you will be gone on vacation during the application period, you may apply early by sending your entry materials to Joyce Hayes.

Early applications must have images, and info sheet with: titles, materials, size, price or value if NFS, gallery affiliation if applicable, website, e-mail address. For each piece, indicate craft category (ceramics,fiber, etc.) Indicate installation needs: pedestal, wall-hung, jewelry case.) Send via e-mail (use subject line: SLU entry) or send a CD through US mail.

South Lake Union Exhibition Schedule:

November 19 entry period begins on "members only" page of NWdesignercraftsmen.org.

December 17 mid-night is the application deadline.

January 16 notification of acceptance

January 25 collection sites begin receiving work

January 29 last day for work drop-off at collection site

Feb 1 work dropped off to SLU

Feb 8 show run begins

May 4th Opening and SLU Art Walk (More information will be available)

May 25 show ends and pick up information will be available in the future

Delivering and picking up artwork:

We will use members homes as collection sites. Location information will come in the acceptance letter.

Size restriction on mailed objects: must be liftable by Joyce and assistant, and fit into a car. If in doubt, contact Joyce.

Your piece will be mailed back to you the same way it was shipped. You are responsible for paying for shipping to and fro. Send a check payable to NWDC for the same amount as the incoming shipment or provide us with your Fed EX account number. Send return shipping labels.

Sales:

All sales will be handled directly between buyer and artist. There is no commission. The wall labels will list price and artist contact: website and/or e-mail. Buyers will contact artist directly. Artists are responsible for arranging payment. Let Joyce Hayes know when a piece is bought, she will contact Peggy Weiss of SLU. When the show is over, the work can be picked up by the buyer. Both Peggy Weiss and Joyce Hayes will know that the work has been purchased. If the piece needs to be shipped, the artist will pick up the piece and ship it.

Before You Begin the Application

Assemble all the images and information you will need in a folder. Then copy and paste the text into the application. Choose imagery from this folder. You will need:


Jpeg images of your work. 1500 - 2000 pixels on the longest side. You may enter 2 pieces.

For each piece you enter, you will need: title (If you need to acknowledge gallery affiliation, use a comma, then "courtesy of _____," after the title.) dimensions (write out the words "inches" or "feet"), materials, price (Use \$ sign. If NFS, put: NFS/insurance value), year.

Installation needs (wall-hung, pedestal, jewelry case, out-door, artist supplied support or specific details of your particular piece) there is no box for installation needs on this form, so we are asking you to put it in the piece description box.

Written description of each piece is optional.

Final tip: Hitting The Submit this Entry button means you are done. It is your final act in submitting your entry. Before hitting this button, make sure you have uploaded both images (plus details) if your are submitting 2 pieces.

In September, Julie Conway was asked to be the feature designer at the IDS West International Interior Design show of Vancouver BC. Her work was suspended from 40 feet over the ticket booths at the entrance of the Vancouver Convention Centre and she also installed a 32-foot high chandelier to be displayed over the VIP Lounge. The show attracted design talent from all over the world including guest speaker Jonathan Adler. Julie's first international show was a big success and will open doors for trade across the border.

Lois Harbaugh has work in Trackside Studio Gallery's *Ode to the Bowl* invitational show in Spokane, WA.

Ode to the Bowl runs from December 4th to January 15.



For "Ode to the Bowl," Ms. Harbaugh created "Breast Bowls." This concept came about as Ms. Harbaugh anticipated the arrival of her first Grandchild and the the ritual of breast feeding that the new mother would experience. The bowl lids reflect the shape of the breast; saucers were added beneath the bowls to give them a ritual vessel quality.

"So much in the vessel world (the shapes generated in the act of throwing on the wheel, and in the resulting object) reflects the human body. These breast bowls are meant to spark the imagination with their sensuous shapes." —Lois Harbaugh



Gurness Broch a wallwork by enamelist **Jean Tudor**, in the collection of Bernard Jazzar and Harold Nelson is included in "Little Dreams in Glass and Metal," the first major enameling exhibition in the US in 50 years. There is a beautiful and comprehensive hardcover catalog available (with the same title as the exhibition) by Nelson and Jazzar. Jean's work was mentioned in Cate McQuaid's review in the Boston Globe (Aug. 1, 2015). The exhibition, currently at the Fuller Craft Museum in Brockton, MA, will be traveling to the Craft and Folk Art Museum (Los Angeles), the Crocker Art Museum (Sacramento), and the Arkansas Art Center (Little Rock) between now and 1 January, 2017.

Jean has this year been filling a vacancy on the Board of Trustees for The Enamelist Society, which had its biennial conference in August in Beverly, MA.

She will be inducted as a Guildmaster of the Grünewald Guild on October 10, in Tacoma at Christ Episcopal Church at a Grunewald "Friend Raiser" reception. Guildmaster is an honor given to those whose life & work emulate the mission of the Guild, and in its 30+ years of existence the Guild has installed 8 previous Guild Masters. The Guild seeks to facilitate the exploration between art and faith/spirituality and provide a space that allows for dialogue and convergence. Jean has taught enameling workshops there for 15 years. She taught basic enameling October 25 – 31st and will teach cloisonné enameling in June 2016.

- An artist's statement or brief bio. 125 words or so, +/- 25
- 1 square cropped picture to use as a thumbnail on the front page. Size doesn't matter very much for this one, just at least 300 or so.

Making a FB Page for your art:

It is best to market your work with a FB Business page. You can start one by going to the HOME page and look at the left side column. You will see a category called PAGES. Click on START A NEW PAGE. From here you can operate your business page. This is truly the best practice as fans do not have to be involved in personal activity.

We will be featuring a focus of media per month on the Facebook page. Along with your regular news of studio events and art exhibitions, please note that we are going to try to drive traffic to our own websites and Facebook pages via the NWDC group page.

How to submit information to the NWDC newsletter

The deadline is the 15th of the month for the next month's newsletter. What is appropriate to submit? Anything in your professional life you would like to share with NWDC members: exhibits, awards, classes, art or studio sales, call for entries, etc. Be sure to include all the information: who, what, when, where & why.

How should text be formatted? Please send your information in the body of an e-mail, not as a Word document. The newsletter editor will copy/paste. Please, do NOT send your text in PDF files or jpeg copies of gallery postcards! The text in jpegs and PDFs cannot be copied and pasted.

What about Images? We want images! They need to be in jpeg format, 72 dpi, about 400 pixels on the longest side. Please include name, title, medium, dimensions, etc. Website addresses are great too.
