
Upcoming Presentations

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A Note from NWDC's Co-President - Lin McJunkin

The energy of spring has invigorated our Board of Directors, who voted on several motions to advance new projects at our April 12 meeting. First, we are funding the eighth artist, jeweler **Ron Ho**, for the next documentary in the *Living Treasures of American Craft* series. Thanks to Ron Pascho, Larry Metcalf and their committee for moving this forward.

We already have \$5300 in our account that remained after the first series was completed. Honorary Members, Alida and Christopher Latham, generously stepped up once again to give us \$10,000 seed money toward the approximately \$45,000 total budget, most of which will come from the private donations of NWDC and art community members, plus grants and awards. Anyone wishing to donate can contact Ron Pascho at. We will also let you know soon when we go live with an online donation account on our website so you can donate easily and directly.

In addition to the legacy work the Board is advancing, we are also looking at the all-important topic of sustaining membership by encouraging participation of emerging artists. To that end, we just voted to institute a proposal by NWDC Treasurer Mark Ditzler for an **Emerging Artist level**, the fourth after General, Lifetime, and Honorary.

Details remain to be worked out, but it looks like candidates for the Emerging Artist level will be sponsored by a current member, pay lower dues, and participate in all NWDC functions in some way. Once they are qualified, they will still have to jury into the group to become full General members.

If you know someone whose work and dedication make them qualified for this membership level, please contact me and I'll get you the form you need when they're finalized. (They will soon be available on our Members Only website.) The Board will vote on the application at the board meeting following its receipt.

Another aspect of our Emerging Artists focus has to do with the awarding of **scholarships**. Our new scholarship program will allow us to use any funds remaining after each year's Angel Fund distribution for awarding up to 3 scholarships of up to \$250 each, for use by a member, or a non-member artist nominated by a member, to further their professional development.

This year, we only had 2 or 3 members who requested assistance in paying their dues through the Angel Fund, leaving us with a balance of \$3765. These funds are given by members at meetings and, next year, online as an option when paying our dues. Once again, the generosity of the Lathams last year added \$2000 to that fund and they are thrilled to help mentor and support young artists.

The Board meeting was followed by a slide presentation of members' work assembled once again into our annual **Image Bank** by volunteer Larkin Van Horn and her husband, Van. The work was new and inspirational and we thank the Van Horns for their work on this important method of sharing what we do.

Working with Wire with Mary Lee Hu

This four-day workshop will cover various ways of working round wire, from twisting, wrapping, looping, braiding and knitting to create textured line, to soumak, weaving and twining to get form. It is designed for the beginner to get an understanding of the many possibilities with wire. For those who have already begun to work in wire, we will also explore finishing off the ends and edges by soldering, as well as looking at surface patterning or complex form creation. Most processes will be introduced in the first two days, with participants making quick samples of those that interest them. The other two days will allow for time to work on a small project or intensive one-on-one with those who have particular questions. Previous experience is desirable, but not absolutely necessary. Those from a fiber background may find working with metal using these fibers techniques to be an interesting variation or addition to their work. ALL LEVELS WELCOME

Instructor: Mary Lee Hu first became fascinated with metalwork during high school courses. For two years, she attended Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, and then went to Cranbrook Academy of Art in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan, to complete her undergraduate degree. She received her masters from Southern Illinois University-Carbondale. It was during this time that Hu started to work with fiber inspired techniques after taking a fiber arts course. This led to the development of her signature style of wire jewelry. Since the late 1960s, Hu has explored the techniques of coiling, wrapping, weaving, knitting and twining wire. Her work consists mostly of twined earrings, rings, bracelets, brooches, and neckpieces that emulate natural forms, movements and symmetry.

After completing her MFA, Hu traveled to various places and took up different teaching positions until she joined the metal arts program at the University of Washington School of Art in 1980. She retired from the University as Professor Emeritus in 2006.

Hu is a member and past president of the Society of North American Goldsmiths. In 1996, Hu was inducted into the American Craft Council College of Fellows. Hu has recieved three National Endowment for the Arts Craftsmen Fellowships. Her work is in major collections such as the Victoria and Albert Museum, the Renwick Gallery, the American Crafts Museum and the Art Institute of Chicago. Hu is the winner of the 2008 Irving and Yvonne Twining Humber Award for Lifetime Artistic Achievement.






Still Crazy After All These Years . . . 30 years in art

Made-for-TV Videos Documenting the Lives of Important Artists and Art Advocates

You may want to know why we started the Living Treasures video project in the first place, about 14 years ago. As a long time member, I knew Luella Simpson, a seminal jeweler and NWDC member, and Don Simpson, who was devoted to our group by creating the book-form roster every few years. Both were elderly when they died fairly close in time. We'd heard they had no family to speak of and that no one knew WHERE Luella's work was. There seemed to be no one archiving neither her history, nor any records of locations of her work. Poof, all gone. That sobered me.

I was not close to them, but as NWDC education chair I was stimulated to honor our elder, high profile members, especially those who had been mentors and were considered living treasures. Thus began the Living Treasures Project.

We had heard that Channel 9 would show our videos if they fit into the half hour format, and sure enough, they did show them. Besides distributing to schools and libraries and museums, we made them available to audiences through sales from Video Catalogues. Now that we've placed the seven completed ones on YouTube, I urge you to view them. See what we've done to further the educational mission of Northwest Designer Craftsmen.

Today, Dick Weiss and I each mailed off donation checks earmarked for the newest video project, a documentary on the life and art of Ron Ho. Please join us in furthering this important and worthwhile effort. Ron has touched the lives of so many and we're certainly proud to have him as a member of our organization.
