Invite Your Colleagues to Apply to NWDC

Prospective members can assess the value of joining NWDC by viewing our member exhibition at the Washington State Convention Center during the month of October. Or they can join you in the self-guided, member studio tour on Whidbey Island on October 13. Or they can meet and greet at our Summer Social on July 21. Each of these events provides a showcase for the amazing talent of our members, lifetime members and honorary members.

NWDC guidelines for new member applicants are described in our bylaws. Applicants should:

- Be a designer, artist, or craftsperson who has achieved a high standard of artistic and technical proficiency.
- Subscribe to high ethical standards in all matters pertaining to his or her art and craft.
- Show an interest in promoting public awareness of and appreciation for design, artistry and craftwork.
- Have an interest in actively participating in the work of NWDC.

Those are the dry qualifications. NWDC has much to offer:

- Members get to know and network with members. Friendships are made. Superb potlucks are consumed.
- We have two excellent exhibition opportunities in line for 2019. (You'll hear more about those in coming days.)
- Planning is well underway for a combination of a symposium, exhibitions and workshops in 2020 to commemorate our 65th Anniversary.
- NWDC has built partnerships with regional museums, such as BAM, offering programming and contacts that will sometimes feature our members and their work.
- Our quarterly education programs have strengthened participation among members and the public.
- The Living Treasures Project continues to find opportunities to showcase exceptional craft makers in the Pacific Northwest.

New Public Art Lin McJunkin Sculpture

NWDC glass artist, Lin McJunkin, has just installed and dedicated a 23' high steel and glass totem pole along the Skagit River on Mount Vernon's Riverwalk Park. The stainless and Coren steel piece features 21 salmon, otter and ravens being chased by a bear up the rock-filled pole to the immense eagle perched on top. Every piece is enlivened by colorful glass inserts created by Lin.

The designs were created by her long-time metal partner, Milo White, assisted by their mutual friend and colleague, Upper Skagit Tribal member Jay Bowen. The piece resides at the west end of Gates Street on the new waterfront parkway and is lit at night for 24/7 viewing, even from the bridge and freeway!

Future Public Art Cheryll Leo-Gwin and Stewart Wong

In 1882, New Mexico's territorial supreme court ruled that Asian Americans had the right to testify before a judge. The decision set a major precedent that spread to courts in other states and territories, but it remains an overlooked breakthrough in the history of civil rights. Too often, it's overshadowed by the Chinese Exclusion Act, a federal law from the same year that limited Chinese immigration and influenced decades of xenophobic policies.

Last month, officials in Bernalillo County, Albuquerque decided to commemorate this little-known case, *Territory of New Mexico v. Yee Shun*, by approving a public sculpture in its honor. Envisioned by Chinese-American artists Cheryll Leo-Gwin and Stewart Wong, the design depicts a giant plumb bob balanced on its tip, to stand outside a district courthouse. It is tilted as a metaphor for tipping the scales of justice. (Hyperallergic Art Journal)

Leo-Gwin and Wong collaborated to submit a proposal responding to the call for art that commemorates the contributions of Chinese Americans in influencing change in the rule of

law allowing Chinese Americans to testify in court. With a significant budget the artists designed a two story monument as a legacy to the history of the Chinese American experience. Installation is anticipated to be completed in the Fall of 2018.

Book Publication Barbara Skelly

NWDC member, Barbara Skelly, published <u>Treasure Houses</u>, <u>Stories of Precious Gems</u> <u>and Diamonds in the Rough</u>, April 2, 2018. This is a memoir that chronicles her experience as an artist, as an art therapist, and the treatment of mental illness.


Coinciding with the publication of the book, Barbara received a grant for the acrylic painting, *Peyton With Flower*, 16" X 20", from the Ryan Licht Sang Bipolar Foundation. The painting was one of twenty works of art selected through a national juried competition and shown in the *2018 INSIGHTS II* art exhibition at the Zolla/Liberman Gallery in Chicago, May 31 - June 2, 2018. It will also be included in the foundation's permanent traveling collection.

This exhibition highlighted the creativity of artists with bipolar disorder and was intended to help diminish the stigma that accompanies that illness. The Ryan Licht Sang

Bipolar Foundation believes that people with bipolar disorder deserve a voice and understands that art can be a powerful way for artists to express both their struggles and their joys. It is dedicated to fostering awareness, understanding and research for early-onset bipolar disorder.



NWDC will be having our next exhibition at the Washington State Convention Center in Seattle. Our show will be juried by Lloyd Herman and the installation will be designed by Larry Metcalf.

All artists entering will have at least one piece chosen and the work does not need to be for

sale; the Convention Center does not take a commission. Sales will be between the artist and the prospective buyer. Each piece of artwork will have a security magnet attached to it. At the end of the prospectus, please look for a photo and explanation of the WSCC security measures.



Ron Ho - A Jeweler's Tale Bellevue Art Museum Exhibition

We are delighted to report that NWDC Living Treasure, Ron Ho, will be featured in a one man exhibition honoring his life and catalog of jewelry at the Bellevue Arts Museum opening July, 2019 showing through October, 2019.



The exhibition will feature a chronology of Ron's necklaces including pieces made after his BAM 2007 retrospective, and the last necklace he worked on before his passing. Additionally, the show will include parts of Ron's studio, his tools and found objects that were still waiting for another Ho masterpiece, his own ethnic jewelry collection, and other objects-d'art from his personal ethnic collections. The Living Treasures video, "Ron Ho Becoming Chinese A Jeweler's Tale," will be a major element of the exhibition.

Ben Heywood, Director/Curator at BAM will co-curate the exhibition with NWDC Vice President, Nancy Loorem Adams. NWDC will also provide educational programs during the exhibition and contribute to the opening festivities.

Update Your Profile on the Website this Month Collectors Need to See Your Images

We expect many collectors to see your work at the Washington State Convention Show during the months of October, November and December. Anyone who wants to know more about your work may go to the NWDC Website first. If you do not have a profile and images on the Website, you may lose an opportunity.

If you already have a personal ID and password, you may sign in and update your profile and images at any time. (If you forgot your password, there is a way to ask for a new one.)

If you don't have a personal ID and password, here's how to get one. We've broken it into several steps, but it is really quite straight forward and simple.

- 1. Log into <u>nwdesignercraftsmen.org</u>
- 2. Go to Members Only
- 3. Enter the password.
- 4. Pull down the menu under Members Only and click on MembershipWorks.
- 5. Enter your email on record with NWDC.
- 6. Click on "ask for password."
- 7. Get the password from your email and enter it. (If you leave the NWDC Website, you must enter the password to get back to the Members Only page.)
- 8. After you enter your password, click the sign in button.
- 9. Scroll to the middle of the page. You will see your personal information including your address, email and personal Website Information. You can update these items there.
- 10. Click on the profile tab. Here you will find simple instructions about uploading images and you can update links to all your social media sites.


